
Keep Families Together






Education

99% of the children we support are first generation learners. Most of them are the first person in their family to attend school. It brings us great satisfaction to see them break patterns in this way. Our education programs are comprehensive, ensuring primary education for all, remedial classes where needed, computer education and an opportunity for each child to attend college. This year, we were also able to ensure 100% school enrollment for our children compared to 55% of Indian children, overall. Also, we had an impressive high school pass rate of 98% to that of 52% of all Indian children (Source: UNESCO,2016).

Miracles You Made

Ranjita (now 21) along with her two brothers and a sister came to a Miracle mentored CCI in 2010 after their parents passed away. Ranjita had been struggling in school due particular subject. However, she was determined to achieve her goal; to get highly educated. With the help of Foundation's Miracle educational programs, Ranjita not only completed her bachelors with flying colors but she also moved ahead to pursue a master's degree in commerce. Today, Ranjita lives in Pune and has enrolled herself in a company secretary course. She is also working as an intern with a chartered accountant in the city to gain knowledge and understanding of the work. In her leisure time, she loves to read books and teach younger children.



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Health & Nutrition

Thanks to supporters like you, we successfully provided regular, high-quality health attention to all children under our care, taught them good health and hygiene habits and provided nutritious and delicious food at every meal.

Quality Health Check-ups!

• We completed health check-ups including hemoglobin tests, annual check-ups on vision, hearing and dental which were followed by treatment if required.

• Our medical partners completed an environmental health audit and conducted orientation & training sessions on different health and hygiene habits for children under our care.

• We measured every child's height and weight on a monthly basis.

• These growth measurements were plotted on children's individual WHO growth charts on a quarterly basis by the housemothers.




Mental Health

As per the World Health Organisation, one out of four teens in India between the ages of 13-15 years suffers from depression. In addition, our children have experienced great adversity such as poverty, trauma, difficult living situations and much more and are at a higher risk of experiencing mental health issues such as, anxiety, fear, depression and other serious conditions. This is why we promote mental health care to the children. Our approach is aimed at cultivating their social and emotional development. We educate them in life skills and help them develop coping strategies. This prepares them for the challenges of everyday life and helps them to achieve their full potential and live a productive life, from childhood to adolescence and into adulthood.



Mental Health Results



A young girl, age 10, was placed in one of our mentored CCIs. At age 12 she started showing signs of behavioral concerns; hyperactivity and lack of concentration. This was brought to the attention of our mental health resource person through the social worker. After a couple of therapy sessions, it was discovered that the child was undergoing symptoms of depression . She was deprived of the loving care and affection of a family and she felt un-loved. After months of therapy and continuous follow-up by our team, the child's symptoms improved. The therapist also re-enforced the need for her to be placed in a family setting. Our team then prepared the child for a session with prospective adoptive parents in consultation with the Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA). Today, this young girl is a part of a beautiful family and continues to thrive.

Miracles You Made

A 15 year old orphaned child was moved to live in one of our mentored CCIs. Due to separation from his two sisters (as they were in a different institution), the child had significant emotional and relationship issues and difficulty adjusting to his new environment





Our social worker began helping the child with one-on-one counselling. She felt that involving him in group activities along with other children would help him adjust after the anxiety of separation. A Miracle Foundation appointed mental health resource person supported the young boy through life book activities which helped him bond with other children.

The young boy soon started to open up to the social worker about his relationship with his sisters.

After a few months of counselling, his relationship with his sisters improved. Our team focused on family bonding through planned meet ups with the child's sisters. Today, he enjoys spending time with his sisters and also looks forward to future bonding.

Miracles You Made



For 35-year-old Deepa, driving an autorickshaw to augment her income as ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) in her village an in Thiruvananthapuram's Annakulam panchayat hasn't been easy. But the hard work bore fruit when she was able to bring her daughter Avani back home in March this year after a four-year stay at one of the Miracle supported children's homes."I became more determined to bring her home after counselling sessions revealed that Avani was stumbling in her exams because of dysgraphia, a writing disability. It was also making her insecure. It was suggested by the counselor that her condition could improve if I brought her home and continued therapy for the disability. People laughed when I started driving the autorickshaw as I was the first woman in the village to do so. But I didn't let it bother me. Miracle Foundation India and the CCI staff helped me. Since Avani came home, she has shown good progress. For me, this is no less than a miracle," said Deepa.

Center for Excellence

Objective: To help more children through a sustainable approach by implementing programs at the Government level. This top-down approach, when combined with bottoms-up programs, can lead to systemic change.

Dreamland Centre for Excellence

- 17 CCI institutions benefited from the program
- 50 staff members of various CCIs trained on Miracle Methodology
- 20 Master Trainers trained to became Life Skills Education trainers
- 396 children educated on Life Skills Education
- 25 children trained in leadership and advocacy
- 400+ children were given vaccinations
- 250 children trained on personal hygiene, sanitation and environmental hygiene.








Center for Excellence

This year, we also hosted two children's leadership councils; one for our children from Western & Norther regions and another for children from our Center for Excellence Model. We prepared children, aging-out (after 18 years) of institutionalized care, to face the outside world. Through this 3-day workshop, we trained them in advanced life skills and leadership development. We empowered children emotionally for the new chapter in their lives through individual counseling, group discussion and sharing opportunities.


